- 1. People within El Sistema really look up to Miami Music Project. They are curious to know how we do it all because they aspire to one day grow in the same way that our organization has over the years. We seem to be forging the path for others and setting an example or the standard. They are paying attention to Miami Music Project (which is motivating but also comes with great responsibility).
- 2. I was impressed by the transparency of MMP's numbers and the quality of programming compared to what I saw. I feel very confident in the program we have.
- 3. The scale and impact of MMP is particularly impressive compared to that of other ES organizations. I understand why we are considered leaders in the field.
- 4. The best part about conferences/symposiums is the opportunity to network. Although it's valuable from a professional standpoint, I think it's so refreshing to talk to like-minded people. Regardless of the differences in our programs, we are connected by common goals and shared values. Sometimes you lose sight of that and it's good to be reminded.
