

TURNING HOPE INTO ACTION

In the wake of COVID-19, Miami Music Project went VIRTUAL, establishing Miami Music Project*Connect* to ensure we continued to Compose Better Lives.

We remained committed to being an important social, educational, and cultural resource for Miami's underfunded communities. As such, we continued providing music instruction, concerts, events, and discussions held safely online via Facebook Live.

EQUITY AND INCLUSION

2020 was a year of civil unrest, tensions and frustration for many oppressed communities. The Black community took a stand against hate and rallied to seek justice.

In partnership with **ReEnvision Harmony & Social Equity** we hosted a series of talks they called *Discomfort Discourse*. We invited community leaders, organizers and champions who guided us through a series of discussions about anti-racism, oppression and our role in these tumultuous times.

Subsequently, with their guidance, we launched our new Equity & Inclusion Committee, focusing on centering the voices of our students, parents, and Teaching Artists.





We rose as a community to overcome the challenges this pandemic presented, and with it we created a storyline of **hope**, **resilience**, and **community**.

When everything was shut down the world turned to the arts to cope and lift spirits. Our students found strength in music, and our programs provided social connection and support. We did so by:

- Connecting families with health and nutrition resources and other service providers







