



## The Peabody Institute Scholarship Recipient

Since 2019, El Sistema USA has partnered with The Peabody Institute of The Johns Hopkins University to award up to two full scholarships annually to students of *El Sistema*-inspired organizations. Elizabeth is the third Miami Music Project student to receive this prestigious award since 2019, with Edric Vivoni awarded last year and Bobby Bush in 2019. In addition, Elizabeth received The Jack Kent Cooke Young Artist Award from the renowned non-profit, From The Top, to help offset the costs of studying classical music at a high level.




### **INSPIRING ARTISTS**


